## 'SITARA' FILM PREMIERE JOINS CHANGEMAKERS IN CONVERSATION TO PROMOTE GIRLS' RIGHT TO DREAM

On October 10, the eve of International Day of the Girl, Gucci and CHIME FOR CHANGE hosted the premiere of *SITARA*, produced with <u>VICE Studios</u>, at the Metrograph Theater in New York City, followed by a panel conversation moderated by activist <u>Kimberly Drew</u>, featuring the following guests:

Compelled by the critical global issue of child marriage, CHIME FOR CHANGE partnered with two-time Academy and three-time Emmy Award-winning director Obaid-Chinoy on SITARA, her new animated short film about Pari, a young girl whose dream of being a pilot is crushed when she is forced into child marriage. It is the story of 12 million girls around the world who are married off as child brides every year.

The group discussed the global prevalence of child marriage, the role of film in activism and how organizations, corporations and civil society can gather together to accelerate progress towards gender equality, among other topics.

"Young girls everywhere still face considerable hurdles in achieving their dreams. SITARA embodies that struggle; it is the story of Pari, a young girl who dreams of becoming a pilot and is robbed of it. It is a story about the burdens of family and the impact of patriarchal culture. For me, SITARA is more than a film, it is a movement that we want to start across the world, that encourages parents to invest in their girls' dreams, freeing their daughters from the burdens of early marriage."

At LetGirlsDream.org, visitors are encouraged to share their dreams and to call on the global community to help break down the barriers that keep so many girls and women from pursuing theirs. Educators globally have the opportunity to request a local screening, discussion materials and activities that encourage girls and young people to share their dreams and inspire one another.
