GUCCI ANNOUNCES SECOND CLASS OF NORTH AMERICA CHANGEMAKERS SCHOLARS

The \$1.5M Scholarship Program ensures a new generation of diverse young people will gain opportunities and education across the fashion industry

New York, July 8, 2021 – Gucci is honored to announce the 2021 class of Gucci Changemakers North America Scholars, furthering its commitment to creating positive change within the fashion industry and empowering the next generation of creative talent. The 22 scholarship recipients come from diverse backgrounds and are pursuing various careers within fashion at community colleges, undergraduate colleges, or universities. They will receive an academic scholarship for up to \$20,000 in addition to mentorship and virtual internship opportunities through Gucci America.

The students in the inaugural 2020 Changemakers class were able to use the funds to attend 14 different schools across North America where they are pursuing various degrees in fashion and the creative arts. One scholar aspires to start her own rental studio space and provide resources to young people who want to explore photography and fashion; another scholar aspires to be a creative director fusing together music, film, and fashion; and another scholar has worked on projects that illustrate and demand conversation around body politics, vulnerability, and identity. Additionally, Gucci has also worked to create opportunities for Scholar recipients by commissioning works for various programs.

Antoine Phillips, Vice President of Brand and Culture Engagement says: *“We are honored to announce the selection of these talented and creative students from all backgrounds and regions in North America. They represent HBCUs, community colleges, fashion schools, and non-fashion schools alike. Their diverse points of views embody the future of not only fashion, but creative industries as a whole. We look forward to engaging with all of our scholars over the coming months ahead.”*

The 2021 class will join the Changemakers community as it continues to grow, offering students the opportunity to pursue their unique path within the fashion industry. When asked about the program, Miles Richards, a 2020 and 2021 Gucci Changemakers Scholar, said *“After being granted the opportunity to be one of the recipients of the Gucci Changemakers Scholars award, I found an unbelievable amount of stress taken off my shoulders. And without a shadow of a doubt, the program provided me with the creative freedom to express myself without the burden of tuition during my first year as an art major.”*

Additionally, under the Changemakers umbrella, Gucci is honored to also announce one recipient of the Gucci North America Changemakers x CFDA Scholars by Design program. This year, all awardees will have the opportunity to participate in the Gucci Program for Scholars, a 6-week long virtual summer program that helps to educate students on the various career paths available within the fashion industry. The program includes fashion industry education, engagement with all departments across Gucci North America, Gucci corporate mentor assignment and skill building workshops.

GUCCI NORTH AMERICA CHANGEMAKERS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The Gucci North America Changemakers Scholarship program was established in March 2019 and sits under Gucci Equilibrium. In its second year, the scholarship program provides funds to undergraduate students with unmet financial needs passionate about careers in the fashion and creative industries. The program primarily focuses on students from diverse backgrounds who live or study in one of the 12 Gucci North America Changemakers cities (see above) and/or plan to attend or currently attend a Historically Black College and University (HBCU). However, all students who meet the eligibility criteria can apply and be considered for an award. Over the last three months, Gucci enlisted the support of the North America Changemakers Council of community leaders and social change experts to make the final selection of the students for the scholarship program.
